An Overview of New Testament Theology

Main theme of the New Testament: God reigns, saves, and satisfies through covenant for his glory in Christ.

Gospel of Matthew: Jesus the Messiah-king climactically fulfills the Old Testament.

Gospel of Mark: Jesus the Messiah and Son of God is a suffering servant and a model for his followers.

Gospel of Luke: Jesus the Messiah fulfills God's plan by seeking and saving the lost. He is concerned especially for Gentiles and outcasts of society.

Gospel of John: Jesus the Messiah and Son of God gives eternal life to everyone who believes in him.

Acts of the Apostles: Jesus the Messiah continues to fulfill God's plan by expanding the early church in the face of opposition through the Holy Spirit's power.

Romans: The gospel reveals how God justifies unrighteous individuals—both Jews and Gentiles—at this stage in the history of salvation.

1 Corinthians: The gospel requires God's holy people to mature in purity and unity.

2 Corinthians: God shows his power through human weakness.

Galatians: both Jews and Gentiles are justified by (and continue to live by) faith in Christ, not by the works of the law.

Ephesians: The church (both Jewish and Gentile Christians) must maintain the unity that Christ powerfully created.

Philippians: Conduct yourselves in a manner worthy of the gospel.

Colossians: Christ is supreme.

1 Thessalonians: Live in light of Christ's imminent coming.

2 Thessalonians: Persevere because the Lord Jesus Christ will return and set all things right, especially by judging his enemies.

1 Timothy: The church must guard the faith by embracing godliness.

2 Timothy: Persevere for the gospel.

Titus: Do what is good by God's grace and be motivated by the gospel.

Philemon: You should love your fellow Christian by valuing them above yourself.

Hebrews: Jesus is superior, so persevere.

James: Faith produces works.

1 Peter: Stand firm in God's grace.

2 Peter: Grow in God's grace and beware of false teachers.

1 John: You can know that you have eternal life in three ways: believing in Jesus,

living righteously, and loving believers.

2 John: Walk in the truth and love by not supporting deceivers.

3 John: Work together for the truth by supporting those who spread it.

Jude: Contend for the faith against grace-perverting immorality.

Revelation: The Lamb will consummate his kingdom for God's glory by saving his people and judging his enemies.
